<p><u>Notes</u></p> <p>(i) If you die in service a lump sum of three year's Pensionable Salary may be payable at the discretion of your Employing Company to your qualifying spouse, children or grandchildren, parents or grandparents, brothers or sisters or to someone who is dependent on you during your lifetime.
